WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest have determined that, for reasons of efficiency and economy, to enter into a shared services agreement with the County of Cape May to provide public safety call answering and dispatch services for emergency calls relating to police, fire and emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, Cape May County has agreed to furnish these services to the Borough of Wildwood Crest through the Cape May County Office of Emergency Management pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Wildwood Crest and the County of Cape May in the spirit of Interlocal cooperation, and in furtherance of the principles underlying the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, have negotiated and agreed upon the terms and conditions of such an agreement that is hereby deem necessary and proper to for the benefit of local and county taxpayers, and to promote public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, a written agreement memorializing and specifying those terms and conditions, has been prepared and has been reviewed, which agreement is entitled "Shared Services Agreement for County Dispatch," and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest is desirous of ratifying this agreement and authorizing its execution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

WHEREAS, the Borough authorized the Municipal Engineer to make application to the Cape May County Open Space Parks & Recreation for funding via Resolution No. 144-18 on April 11, 2018; and

WHEREAS, on May 22, 2018, the Open Space Review Board thoroughly reviewed, deliberated and voted to make a recommendation to the Board of Chosen Freeholders to fund the project known as "Sunrise Park Recreation Improvements" in an amount not to exceed \$283,625.00; and

WHEREAS, on December 11, 2018, a public hearing was held on the defined project and the County of Cape May agreed to enter into Shared Services Agreement to provide reimbursement funds to the Borough to undertake the Sunrise Park Recreation Improvements for the term of February 12, 2019 through February 11, 2020.

ADMINISTRATOR REPORT:

December 27, 2018

Kayak Launch/ Sunset Lake Shoreline Stabilization

The critical shop drawings (mats, stone, etc.) have been reviewed and approved. Due to the holidays, South State is waiting until the first week of January to begin work at the site. This is later than they had stated earlier, but according to our coastal engineer it's preferable since the gap between when they finish the stone removal and begin work on the mats (which will be later due to lead times) will be reduced, effectively reducing the length of time the site is disturbed.

Beach/ Dune Project

I received word that USACE and NJDEP Coastal Engineering will be coming down to meet with us either the week of January 7, 2019 or the week of January 28, 2019. At this time their position is that all comments have been made on the 60% plans and there will be no more changes from municipalities.

Redevelopment of New Jersey Avenue Business District (UEZ Zone)

Mayor Cabrera and I had a very productive phone call with T&M Associates at which time we requested a proposal for the Borough's portion of planning the aesthetic improvements to the New Jersey Avenue Business District. I will provide that to you as soon as I receive it.

Grants

1) Cape May County Open Space and Recreation Applications 2018

The shared service agreement for the improvements to Sunrise Park has been authorized this morning. Once the 45-day comment period has ended we will be able to authorize our engineer to go out to bid on this project.

2) New Jersey Prevention Network Get Active NJ

Installation of mile markers is expected when the weather breaks.

Old Library Building

Bill McLees has submitted his anticipated budget for the planned renovations. We had a pre-application meeting with Cape May County Open Space and continue to explore other funding opportunities for this project. The results of that meeting were that the Open Space Board would consider an application for outdoor, site improvements only. I have asked that our architect carve out this portion of the project for further consideration.

We have submitted a DCA-Small Cities Grant Application for \$400,000 to renovate the bathrooms and make them ADA compliant. We should be hearing back from DCA on this grant application by mid-January. The virtual walk-through and preliminary plans are posted on our website for the public's review and input.

Local Concept Development Study for Ocean Drive (CR 621) for Upgrades & Bridge Improvements

Nothing new to report currently.

Garden State Parkway/ RT 109 Signage

According to NJDOT's Roger Sequeria signs are made and in queue for installation shortly. I followed up with Roger via email last week and am awaiting a response.

Beach Signage

The preliminary draft version of the new beach rules and street side sign designs have been approved. We have made comments to the designer and expect the final draft of the park identification signs shortly. Once we have all three designs (including the park signs) approved we will be produce bid specifications and go out to bid for the manufacture of our new signs prior to the 2019 summer season.

Reconstruction of Newark Avenue and Replacement of the Sanitary Sewer

All work has been completed on Newark Avenue with the exception of the final surface course paving. We are waiting until late January to see if we will allow the contractor to proceed with paving if the weather is conducive and there aren't any settlement issues. Upon recommendation of our Borough Engineer, final surface course paving will occur in either late January or early Spring 2019.

Replacement of Boiler in Borough Hall

Final punch list items were completed, and training of our Public Works personnel is also completed. Close out procedures will now commence for this project.

Centers Designation

As I previously reported, I have received word from the Department of State's Steven Carp stating that our Centers Designation expiration date has been changed from December 31, 2018 to June 30, 2020. This is great news.

Pacific Avenue Flooding

As previously reported, we met with Bob Church of the County Engineering Department in a second meeting on November 19th to discuss ongoing, persistent flooding along Pacific Avenue between Rambler and Jefferson. Bob was very helpful and indicated that the County is willing to act in partnership with the Borough to resolve these ongoing flooding issues. We hope to enter into a shared services agreement toward addressing the design of the drainage facilities. Marc DeBlasio has submitted a proposal for the design of the drainage facilities needed along Pacific Avenue and the proposed 5 ancillary storm water trunk lines to connect the Pacific Avenue drainage into the existing Borough outfalls and the County will in-turn provide a base survey and base mapping of the Pacific Avenue

corridor and the municipal streets on which the proposed outfalls are proposed. These plans will act as the base mapping for the Borough's design plans which Marc will prepare. Once the plans are complete, the County will prepare bid documents for the drainage along Pacific Avenue and pay for the construction cost of the county drainage improvements. Once the drainage is in place, the County will eventually resurface and improve the roadway under a separate contract.

CORRESPONDENCE / PRESENTATION:

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Victoria Dolan, 6400 Atlantic Avenue, inquired about residents that have First Alert and if there will be a seamless transition when going from our local dispatch to the county. Marty Pagliughi confirmed the transition will be seamless and there are actually several systems that will get transferred over including First Alert.

Nancy Pietropaoli, 6002 Seaview Avenue, inquired about the borough calendars and she was told that the Borough is expecting them on Friday, December 28th and she was also informed that there will be trash pickup on Monday, December 31st.

Dennis Travascio, 112 E. Louisville Avenue, had several comments:

1. Ordinance No. 1283 – and why it was pulled. Mayor Cabrera indicated that more homework was needed on the ordinance and it would most likely be going to a referendum in November 2019.
2. Resolution #3 on agenda – The Administrator explained that it was a grant from the County Open Space and that the Borough must first spend the money and get reimbursed from the county.
3. Resolution #1 – County Dispatch clarification. The Administrator indicated that the Borough was going into a Shared Services with the County of Cape May for Dispatch Services.

DISCUSSION:

OLD BUSINESS:

-Bulkhead issue- Survey work to be done in the New Year. Letters went out via certified mail to homeowners on the bay about the survey.

-Solar Panels: The Engineer and Commissioner of Public Safety met to discuss language and specific properties.

-Potential Ordinance amending 20 minute parking- Waiting for an inventory from Ralph Grassi.

-“Share the Road” campaign- The Administrator indicated she would follow up again with Rails to Trails for grant money.

-Bike Racks- Waiting on assessment from Ralph Grassi.

NEW BUSINESS:

None.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY:

Dennis Travascio, 112 E. Louisville Avenue, brought up contractors and Lotus Avenue and docks on sidewalks and streets and inquired about the current ordinance the borough has with regard to silt fences. The Administrator indicated there would be changes to the construction site ordinance and just recently, she met with a local builder who brought up similar concerns to our code enforcement and they would be taking a heavier handed approach. Commissioner Thompson indicated that our Code Enforcement Officers go to many sites and issues summons. In summation, the Mayor added that our Code Enforcement Officers are aware and that there are changes coming to the current ordinance and encouraged the public to take pictures and send them in and they will be addressed.

Victoria Dolan, 6400 Atlantic Avenue, agreed with Mr. Travascio about the silt fences and making changes to the current ordinance.

Hearing nothing further from the public, Mr. Cabrera motioned, seconded by Mr. Thompson that the meeting be adjourned. Both commissioners were in favor and the time was 10:01 a.m.
