**ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:**

**February 2, 2018**

**Kayak Launch/ Sunset Lake Shoreline Stabilization**

As previously reported, the Army Corps and NJDEP have issued permits for this project. DEP approvals are conditional upon certain requirements. We currently await word application for Cape May County Open Space Parks and Recreation Funding for just over \$300,000 to pay for recreational improvements including an ADA kayak/paddle board launch, fishing and observation pier and replacement pavilion as well as a drinking/filling station, some low level lighting, necessary concrete improvements and bike racks. We expect to do a presentation before them sometime in February with Freeholder consideration at their board meeting following the presentation and recommendation of the Open Space Board.

This past week I was instructed to contact our coastal engineer and Chief of Police so that they could request an extension of time beyond October 30, 2018 from FEMA to allow both the recreational amenities and shoreline stabilization to be constructed simultaneously with one contractor in the fall in of 2018. Chief McGrath spoke to Israel Rivera of the New Jersey State

Police OEM on Wednesday. Officer Rivera stated that a request for extension has never been denied in the past and as long as we are showing progress towards completion of the FEMA project, a request for extension should not be a problem. He further explained that we are too far out from the deadline at this time to file for this extension. He suggested that the formal request be made this summer.

### **Beach/ Dune Project**

Nothing new to report at this time. Weekly progress calls to Chris Constantino continue.

### **Storm Drainage**

The final Bulkhead and Beach Outfall Evaluation Report was submitted by our engineer on January 9<sup>th</sup>. It is currently under review by the governing body.

### **Rio Grande Avenue Gateway Improvement Project**

Nothing new to report at this time.

### **Cape May County Open Space And Recreation Applications 2018**

The County is accepting 2018 Open Space and Recreation applications and the first deadline is April 16<sup>th</sup>. Submissions must be made in accordance with CMCOS guidelines. Three options are currently three options being contemplated. They are: 1) increasing the family oriented recreational amenities at Sunrise Park. This is a large parcel that offers plenty of room for expansion, 2) redesigning the Scoop Taylor Park and playground. This playground is out of date and needs upgrades, and could be better situated to allow for additional parking and amenities or 3) a combination application including both Scoop Taylor and Sunrise Park.

### **Taxi Cab Licensing**

At the request of cab companies, the Wildwoods have been working on a way to license cabs in only one municipality. This will avoid duplication of efforts and streamline the licensing efforts. Our solicitor has reviewed the shared services agreement presented by Wildwood and finds it is acceptable in its draft form. We await finalization of this agreement by Wildwood. According to our solicitor Wildwood also has to amend their ordinance to increase the number of licenses from 18 to 25 to account for all of the licenses in total between the three towns. The Crest's ordinance already recognizes Taxi Cab licenses from Wildwood, and NW. He recommends authorizing entering the shared services agreement once finalized, and then wait until Wildwood is ready to start issuing licenses under their ordinance.

### **Cyber Security**

Eric Wong (our IT professional) has completed all work necessary to have complete off-site storage of our critical data. He has been working on this in conjunction with our migration to Microsoft for email. This is extremely important to the continuity of government in the case of a disaster. We should be able to recover all data very quickly if we ever do have an issue. Also, the backup of our data offsite in multiple secure locations will ensure that we are a level 2 entity and will lower our Cyber Security deductible to only \$2,500 rather than \$10,000.

### **Redevelopment of New Jersey Avenue Business District (EUZ Zone)**

A conference call took place on Wednesday, January 31, 2018 with Roger Brooks, his secretary Kayleen, Patrick Davenport, Mayor Cabrera and myself. Mr. Brooks is renowned consultant who has worked with Destination Resorts planning resort villages throughout the world including Whistler British Columbia and Hilton Head Island, North Carolina and will coming to the Wildwood Convention Center on May 8<sup>th</sup> to speak. Mr. Brooks began working with municipalities and cities throughout the United States several years ago. His first municipal client was Ocean Shores in Oregon. He was hired to study Ocean City, New Jersey just before Superstorm Sandy and has spoken here before.

The purpose of the call was to discuss the possible redevelopment of New Jersey area which is stated as a federally-funded, county road reconstruction in 2021. The County Engineer is the preliminary phase of planning and has requested the Crest's input as soon as possible to allow for proper planning. The Mayor, Patrick and I met with the County Engineer on February 1<sup>st</sup>, the day after our preliminary call with the County Engineer Dale Foster.

During our call with he Mr. Brooks explained that the #1 activity for all tourists and visitors is shopping, dining and entertainment. He added that 80% of non-lodging tourism is spent on shopping, dining and entertainment and 70% of all spending takes place after 6 pm.

Mr. Brooks said the biggest issue a town wishing to redevelop faces is figuring out "what it wants to be when it grows up." He stated that towns need to find their focus and suggests that they initially concentrate on 3 blocks. He recommended that the 3 blocks be selected based on the willingness of the property owners to cooperate with the proposed plan. He added that this will lead to the other property owners in neighboring blocks asking for improvements to their blocks. He mentioned that food is huge for everyone and stated that it is important to orchestrate your mix of business in the improvement district to his 10/10/10 rule. That is 1) 10 places that serve food 2) 10 places that provide destination retail (book stores, gift stores, apparel, etc.) and 3) of the 20 establishments at least 10 must be open after 6 pm when 70% of the spending occurs. He encouraged the town to negotiate with store owners to mandate in their lease that at least 10% of the stores be open late.

Mr. Brooks stated that the Borough should supply beautification enhancements such as flowers, street scape improvements, lighting improvements and other enhancements while the property owners make a commitment to creating affordable, rentable space that fits with the vision of the redevelopment. In other words, what the town wants to be when it grows up.

Mr. Brooks charges \$5000.00 for one full day of his time and an initial look at a town and \$7500 for 1 ½ days. His fee for a complete evaluation of a municipality is \$25,000 and a complete action plan would cost \$85,000 for a total of \$110,000.

In our meeting with Dale Foster yesterday, he explained that the County is seeking federal funding to reconstruct New Jersey Avenue from Cresse to Rambler. He reported that he is only able to apply for 1 project per year and New Jersey Avenue is planned for 2021. This came at the request of former Mayor Groon. The County will pay for the reconstruction of the road itself as well as sidewalks to the property line, curbs and gutters. When asked he stated that stamped concrete could be included in this work. He stated that the Crest would be responsible for lighting, storm water, and sewer improvements. The vision for this area was discussed with the focus on a pedestrian-friendly, downtown area that is vibrant and attracts visitors and local property owners. He asked that our planner work closely with the County Engineering on planning this important project. I will be attending the Wildwood Crest Planning Board meeting next Wednesday to provide a report.

## **ENGINEER'S REPORT:**

### **Grant Applications**

1. FY2018 NJDOT Local Aid
  - The Borough selected to submit the reconstruction of Newark Avenue-Phase 2. The application was submitted by the October 6, 2017 deadline.
  
2. Cape May County Open Space Program
  - Cape May County Open Space Board notified all municipalities that applications for park and recreation development are being accepted for 2018.
  - The application deadline for the first round of funding in 2018 is April 16<sup>th</sup>.
  
3. New Jersey Direct Install Program
  - The Borough is eligible to receive a 70% grant for energy efficient improvements including the replacement of certain HVAC units, lighting, lighting controls and water closets.
  - We have submitted a proposal to the Borough to file this grant application.

### **Capital Projects**

1. Reconstruction of Newark Avenue
  - Certified mailings to property owners notifying them of the proposed project have been sent from the Clerk's office.
  - The project is approximately 80% complete and we are waiting for a determination from NJDOT on the second grant application.
  
2. Sanitary Sewer Master Plan
  - Our office has started to meet with Public Works to identify streets that require sanitary sewer and roadway surface improvements on a priority basis.
  
3. Storm Sewer Evaluation and Flood Mitigation Master Plan
  - We have submitted a proposal to the Borough to develop a storm sewer and flood mitigation master plan.
  - The goal of the plan is to identify sources of flooding, corrective action to mitigate flooding and chart a prioritized capital plan to effectuate the improvements.
  
4. Solar Power Purchase Agreement (SPPA)
  - The Borough has the potential to obtaining electrical energy savings thru a solar power purchase agreement (SPPA).
  - We have submitted a proposal to the Borough to investigate the installation of solar at the following Borough properties:
    1. Borough Hall
    2. Ambulance Corps
    3. Crest Pier Recreation Center
    4. Lifeguard Station

5. Nesbitt Tourism/ Info Center
6. Public Works
7. Von Savage Memorial Pool
8. Old Library Building

### **General**

1. Bulkhead & Storm Sewer Outfall Inspection
  - The report was completed and delivered to the Borough on December 19<sup>th</sup>.
  - Our office inspected forty-one (41) bulkheads and six (6) beach outfalls.
  - All of the Borough's bulkheads and outfalls were rated in very good to good condition.
  - There were two (2) beach bulkheads that require priority repairs: Charleston Avenue and Rambler Road.
2. 2018-2019 Emergency Sanitary Sewer Contract
  - Our office is currently working on the specifications and are scheduled to present the Commissioner's with a bid schedule at the February 21<sup>st</sup> meeting.
3. 2018-2019 Roadway and Paving Contract
  - Our office is currently working on the specifications and are scheduled to present the Commissioner's with a bid schedule at the February 21<sup>st</sup> meeting.

### **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Steve Mainardi, 5710 Lake Road, was recently denied a street opening permit due to a moratorium on Lake Road. South Jersey Gas was also denied a street opening at the same property around the same time, but their contactor, ULS, went ahead and opened the roadway anyway to install natural gas. Mr. Mainardi asked for the Borough to reconsider in light of SJ Gas providing written confirmation that they will mill and repave the entire block. The Engineer and Administrator both recommended that the Borough allow Mr. Mainardi to receive the street opening. The Clerk indicated she will have a resolution ready for the next meeting effective the date of the February 2, 2018 meeting.

DelmoSports, LLC requested to use the logos for an upcoming race for promotional purposes. The Administrator and Solicitor will be working on the resolution and should be ready at the 2-21-18 meeting.

**Sunset Lake Extension:**

The Mayor indicated that the Administrator and the Chief of Police have been in contact with New Jersey State OEM, Israel Rivera, with a possible extension on the Sunset Lake start date for September (after the summer). Commissioner Thompson added that Chief McGrath suggested an artist's rendering board down at Sunset Lake so people can see the finished product.

**Fleet Inventory – Department Requests:**

The Mayor would like to see a process in place for all of our vehicles regardless of department. The Administrator indicated that we currently have one that is included in our Fixed Assets Inventory and that all vehicles are included.

**Doors at Joseph Von Savage Pool:**

Commissioner Gould asked about the status of ADA accessible doors at the pool. The Engineer indicated he was reviewing all of the doors at all of the public buildings and would hopefully be applying for a grant.
