ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

August 8, 2018

Kayak Launch/ Sunset Lake Shoreline Stabilization

Our Coastal Engineer- Tom Thornton has prepared the bid and construction schedule. The notice to bidders will be authorized at the August 22, 2018 meeting. The necessary advertisement to bid will be published on August 29, 2018, receipt of bids on October 2, 2018 a tentative award of contract at our Commissioner's meeting on October 10, 2018. We have formally requested an extension of time from FEMA to accommodate this bidding and construction schedule and await official word from FEMA.

Beach/ Dune Project

We now have an electronic and the requested paper copy of the Army Corps 60% plans. Tom Thornton and I are currently reviewing them for comment.

Redevelopment of New Jersey Avenue Business District (UEZ Zone)

Roger Brooks' presentation is currently posted on our website. We will continue to work with the Cape May County Engineering Department on the New Jersey Avenue roadway design and work with our planner on this long-term redevelopment project. In the meantime, we are looking at short term ideas for 2019. The Mayor and I recently met with Michelle Taylor of the Taylor Design Group to go over some short-term improvements that we can begin working on this fall.

Grants

1) Cape May County Open Space and Recreation Applications 2018

The Cape May County Open Space Board has made their recommendation to the Freeholder Board to fund the Sunrise Park portion of the application in the amount of \$283,625. We await word on the date of the Freeholder Board's hearing on this recommendation has been set I will advise.

2) New Jersey Prevention Network Get Active NJ

Mile markers will be installed on our walking/jogging and bike path by early fall. We have secured pricing, have a design and are ready to order the markers.

Old Library Building

Nothing new to report. We received the third and final architectural proposal yesterday and are evaluating proposals at this time.

Local Concept Development Study for Ocean Drive (CR 621) for Upgrades & Bridge Improvements We just received word that the third stakeholders meeting has been scheduled for August 14, 2018 at 2 pm at the County Administration Building. I will attend and report back on any new developments at our next meeting.

Affordable Housing Compliance

As our Order of Fairness and Compliance has been approved after final review by the Fair Share Housing Center implemented the collection development fees as of August 1, 2018.

Garden State Parkway/ RT 109 Signage

A follow-up to NJDOT and subsequent email response has revealed that the signs are in the design phase. I do not have an exact date on which they will be installed.

Beach Signage

The Atlantic County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund has provided all municipalities with guidance to limit liability through the use of uniform beach signage. We have established a beach signage committee and have met on two occasions to discuss and development new beach signage for the 2019 bathing season. Key components of the new signs will be universal symbols in addition to wording and a QR code which can be used to link directly to our mobile app. As we get closer to a draft of the actual signage I will let you know. We obtained a price from Finch to design the signs and are looking at funding options.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Grant Applications

1. Cape May County Open Space Program

- ➤ We presented the application to the Cape May County Open Space Board (CMCOSB) on May 22nd.
- ➤ In a July 18, 2018 letter, the CMCOSB recommended that Sunrise Park be funded by a \$283,625.00 grant.

2. New Jersey Direct Install Program

- ➤ The Borough is eligible to receive a 70% grant for energy efficient improvements including the replacement of certain HVAC units, lighting, lighting controls and water closets.
- The State has completed the audit of the HVAC systems and the lighting. The final report and grant offer is scheduled to be transmitted to our office the week of August 6th.

3. FY2019 NJDOT Municipal Aid Program

- The NJDOT has announced that they are accepting State Aid applications for Roadways, Bikeways, Pedestrian, Safe Streets to Transit and Transit Village projects.
- > The grant application deadline is October 8, 2018.

Capital Projects

- 1. Reconstruction of Newark Avenue and Jefferson Avenue Sanitary Sewer Replacement
 - The Bid Opening occurred on June 13, 2018. The bid was awarded to Perna Finnigan, Inc. in the amount of \$972,349.04 based on the award of Alternate Bid #3.
 - A pre-construction meeting was held on Thursday, July 12, 2018 at 2:30 PM.
 - The Jefferson Avenue sanitary sewer replacement from Pacific Avenue to Seaview Avenue was added to the contract via change order.
 - Construction is scheduled to start September of 2018.

2. <u>Storm Sewer Evaluation and Flood Mitigation Master Plan</u>

- The goal of the plan is to identify sources of flooding, corrective action to mitigate flooding and chart a prioritized capital plan to effectuate the improvements.
- ➤ We are in the process of collecting information on the storm sewer facilities with the Borough and developing storm sewer GIS mapping. At this juncture, we have collected asbuilt information on over 300 storm sewer inlets and manholes for our investigative purposes.

3. FY 2018 NJDCA Small Cities Program

- ➤ The Borough has successfully petitioned NJDCA to utilize FY 2017 grant funding for the FY 2018 project.
- ➤ The FY 2018 grant application included ADA access improvements for five (5) Borough street ends.
- Our office submitted a proposal on July 18, 2018 and upon authorization we will prepare the bid documents.

The Mayor added that thus far, the Engineer has done an ADA Analysis, Bulkhead Inventory and Sanitary Sewer and now he is working on the Storm Water Outfall and all of these will be used when looking at projects with future funding. He added that NJDOT application and award amounts have increased and asked the Engineer if some of the dune project and bike path were eligible for some funding or perhaps the proposed turnaround at Rambler. The Engineer indicated he would check.

CORRESPONDENCE:

The Clerk indicated a correspondence was received by John Gericke regarding smoking on beaches and his hope the Commissioners make it 100% smoke free. The Clerk noted it was received on 8-3-18 at 5:16 pm and sent to the Commissioners for their review.

PRESENTATION #1:

Paul Miola (AJ Gallagher) gave a brief overview of the Atlantic County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund and how the Borough of Wildwood Crest was doing.

PRESENTATION #2:

Tom Thornton and Jason Harkins (Mott MacDonald) began setting up and the Mayor decided to go to Public Commentary in the meantime.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

James Zecca, 115 E. Hollywood Avenue, thanked the Governing Body for the light at Aster and Park Blvd and hoped to get a light at New Jersey and Palm Avenues. Secondly, he asked that the grass at the pool be cut and that it is too high. The Mayor added that he will address with Public Works. Next, he asked about if the Administrator's report was available for viewing and he felt the New Jersey Avenue was a high risk project. The Mayor added that Mr. Roger Brooks' presentation was online and then Mr. Zecca wanted to know more about what items were necessary before money was spent. The Mayor indicated that we are a tourism based community and that we need to study the process and we need to work with the County. Lastly, the Mayor added there will be transparency, many meetings and presentations and that it will be a work in progress.

PRESENTATION #2: continued

Mr. Tom Thornton gave an overview of the project known as Sunset Lake Shore Stabilization and Recreation Improvements. He indicated there are four elements: kayak launch, observation platform, gazebo and associated improvements. It was noted that the kayak dock will be removed at the end of the summer season and housed at the Department of Public Works, the kayak launch would be free of charge and also available for paddle boarding and fishing.

Dennis Travascio, 112 East Louisville Avenue, inquired about the platform being placed on top of the concrete stairs. Mr. Thornton indicated that FEMA will be funding the undermining and that will be covered in the base bid and all other items will be in a supplemental bid.

Ron Becker, 201 W. Charleston Avenue, asked if the benches that would flank the new gazebo would be level and he was assured they would be.

Mr. Becker then thanked the governing body for reappointing Patricia A. Feketics as Municipal Clerk, with Tenure, and he applauded her work ethic, her demeanor and her smile.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

The Mayor opened the floor once again for public commentary.

Tony Burton, 401 East Charleston Avenue, had several inquiries. The first was about the process for determining the placement for umbrella vendor and port o potties. The Mayor added that the umbrellas are done by bid and set for three years. The port o potties are every 4 blocks or so and they could re-visit the street placement at the beginning of the summer 2019. Next, Mr. Burton

inquired about the beach rakes and how close they come to the bulkhead. The Mayor added that the USACE is going to be building another dune and the Borough is seeking to have another path added in that area. Next, the topic of dune signage was faded and asked if they could be replaced. The Mayor added that he would look into it. Next, Mr. Burton asked about the legislation prohibiting smoking on the beach. The Administrator added that if the Borough went in the direction of banning smoking that it would be hard to enforce.

Chief Joseph McGrath, Wildwood Crest Police Department, thanked everyone for their support for National Night Out and it was huge success. Commissioner Dave Thompson commended all of the departments for their outstanding efforts.

-Designated smoking areas for municipal buildings- Mayor Cabrera indicated that the Green Team has recommended that there be a designated area for smoking at municipal buildings. The Administrator added that if we ban smoking that there is a potential for smokers to go to neighboring properties and that could cause more problems.

Kim Gericke, 120 W. Cardinal Road, was a proponent for a designated area for smokers.
