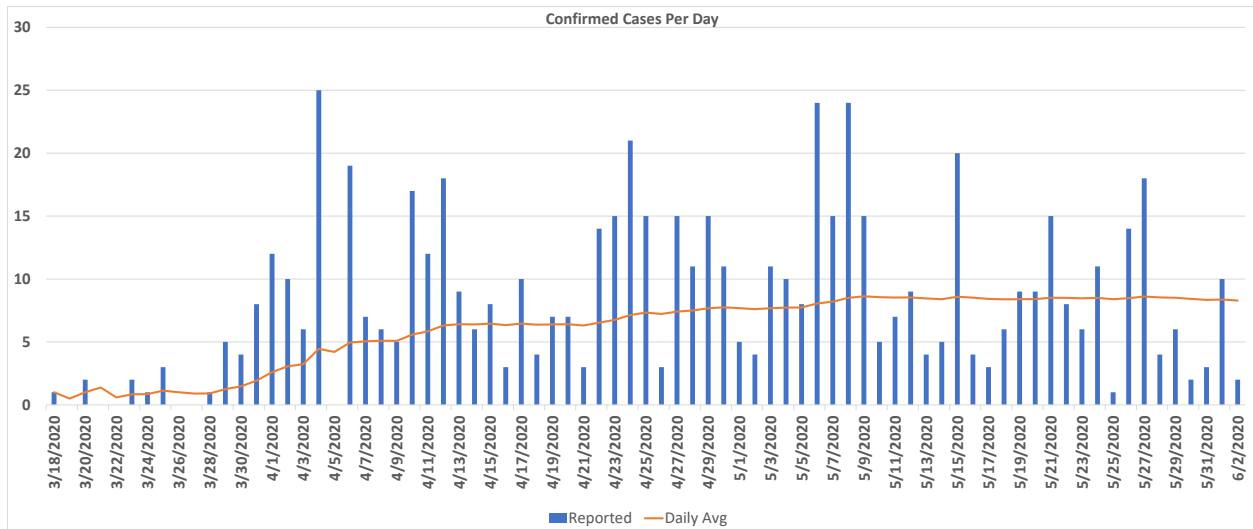

New Jersey will be allowed to reopen with restrictions on June 15 as the state prepares to enter Stage 2 of its recovery from the pandemic. Beginning on June 15, outdoor dining at restaurants can begin, as can non-essential in-person retail.

Governor Murphy said during a news conference that horse racing can begin as soon as next weekend, while child-care centers can open on June 15. Organized sports can return a week later, and day camps by July 6. On Monday, June 22, salons and barber shops can reopen.

“The state's coronavirus outbreak trends are heading in the right direction,” said Murphy. If trends continue to go in the right direction, church and other religious services could resume by June 12. Businesses deemed nonessential like casinos, gyms, salons and retail are still closed.

It's not until Stage 3 that residents will be able to engage in more social activities. Stage 3 would include expanded dining and expanded personal care with appropriate safeguards such as face masks and six feet social distancing measures. Workers would be able to return to the workplace with modifications, and bars and entertainment facilities could operate again at limited capacity.
