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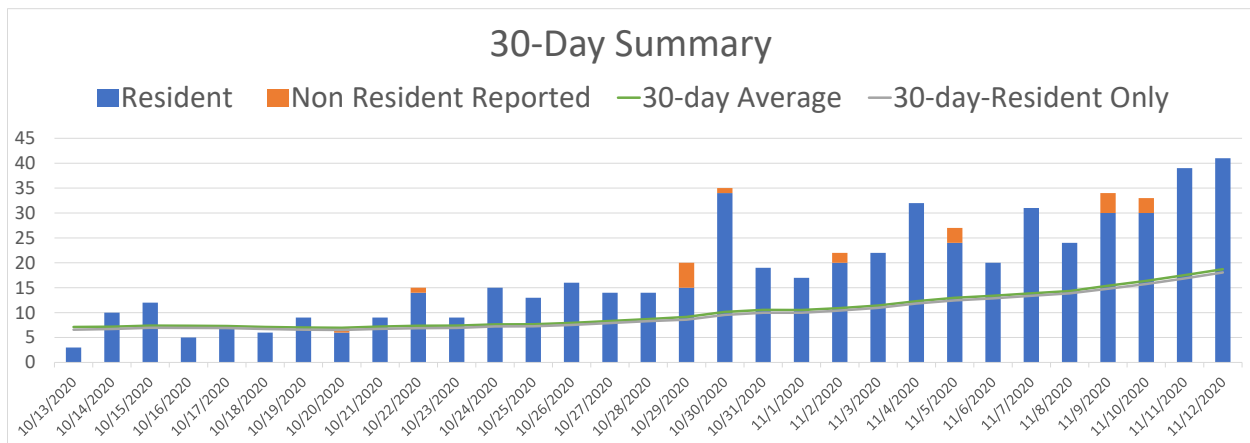


FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: November 12, 2020

Cape May Court House- The County of Cape May Department of Health is reporting 41 new positive cases among County residents. Currently, 1390 County residents are now off quarantine.

Total positive cases of COVID-19 infection in Cape May County is now 1991 including 96 deaths.

Before You Travel

Before you travel, consider the following:

- **Is COVID-19 spreading at your destination?**
The more cases at your destination, the more likely you are to get infected during travel and spread the virus to others when you return.
- Check Each State's Cases in the Last 7 Days
- Travel Recommendations for Destinations Around the World
- **Do you live with someone who might be at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19?**
If you get infected while traveling, you can spread the virus to loved ones when you return, even if you don't have symptoms.
- **Are you at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19?**
Anyone can get very ill from the virus that causes COVID-19, but older adults and people of any age with certain underlying medical conditions are at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19.
- **Does your destination have requirements or restrictions for travelers?**
Some state, local, and territorial governments have requirements, such as requiring people to wear masks and requiring those who recently traveled to stay home for up to 14 days. Check territorial, tribal and local public health websites for information before you travel. If you are traveling internationally, check the destination's Office of Foreign Affairs or Ministry of Health or the US Department of State, Bureau of Consular Affairs, Country Information for details about entry requirements and restrictions for arriving travelers, such as mandatory testing or quarantine.

If You Travel

During your trip, take steps to protect yourself and others from COVID-19:

- Wear a mask to keep your nose and mouth covered when in public settings, including on public transportation and in transportation hubs such as airports and stations.
- Avoid close contact by staying at least 6 feet apart (about 2 arms' length) from anyone who is not from your household.
- Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer (with at least 60% alcohol).
- Avoid contact with anyone who is sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
