The Clerk was present for the meeting telephonically.

The Deputy Mayor read the following statement: In compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975, the notice requirements have been satisfied as to the time, place and date of holding said COMCAST HEARING by posting notice on the bulletin board in Borough Hall, and by mailing and emailing same to the Herald of Cape May County on January 28, 2026 and in Compliance with P.L. 2025, Chapter 72 the notice requirements have been satisfied by advertising the hearing notice on the Borough of Wildwood Crest's official internet website and on [www.njlegals.com](http://www.njlegals.com) on March 4, 2026.

Mr. DeAndrea, Senior Director of Government Affairs for Comcast in New Jersey was present for meeting.

Mr. DeAndrea thanked the Board of Commissioners for holding this hearing on Comcast's municipal application for renewal of their franchise agreement in Wildwood Crest. The hearing is required by State statute and regulations, and provides an opportunity for members of the public to present their views on Comcast's application.

There were no additional members from the public for the meeting.

The franchise is Comcast's license to serve the residents of Wildwood Crest and allows them to build, repair, and operate in the Borough's rights-of-way. The franchise agreement is non-exclusive, so it does not prevent other companies from serving the borough.

On January 26, 2023, Comcast of Wildwood, LLC began the renewal process by sending written notice to the Borough of Wildwood Crest indicating their intention to seek a renewal of their cable television franchise. On December 17, 2025 Comcast filed its municipal application for renewal of municipal consent with the Borough along with a map of their network in Wildwood Crest.

Mr. DeAndrea noted that no action is required at this hearing; it is simply an opportunity for both the governing body and Comcast to hear from the public. The community feedback expressed at the hearing can be incorporated into the dialogue of future meetings between the Borough of Wildwood Crest and Comcast and can be reflected in the municipal consent ordinance.

Again, the draft municipal consent ordinance must go to the Board of Public Utilities prior to Introduction for their consent.

The floor was opened for comments from the governing body and the public. Again, there were members of the public present. The governing body was satisfied with the hearing.

Hearing nothing further, the Clerk recessed the meeting to reconvene at 5:00 pm for the normally scheduled commission meeting with a motion from Mrs. Fuscellaro and a second from Mr. Franco. Both were voted in the affirmative. The time was 4:06 p.m.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF WILDWOOD CREST ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR THE RESPONSIBLE USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI) BY MUNICIPALITIES IN THE ATLANTIC COUNTY MUNICIPAL JOINT INSURANCE FUND (ACMJIF)**

**WHEREAS**, Artificial Intelligence (AI) technologies have the potential to enhance municipal operations, improve public services, and address community needs; and

**WHEREAS**, the use of AI must be guided by ethical principles, transparency, accountability, fairness, and respect for individual rights to ensure public trust and prevent harm; and

**WHEREAS**, municipalities in the ACMJIF recognize the importance of adopting a policy to govern the responsible use of AI in alignment with federal, state, and local laws, including the New Jersey Open Public Records Act (OPRA) and relevant cybersecurity standards; and

**WHEREAS**, this policy establishes guidelines for ethical use, transparency, accountability, fairness, data privacy, public engagement, procurement, risk assessment, and continuous monitoring of AI systems within municipal operations; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Governing Body of the Borough of Wildwood Crest, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, that the following policy for the responsible use of AI is hereby adopted:

**RESPONSIBLE USE OF AI POLICY**

The Borough of Wildwood Crest shall use AI technologies to enhance public services, improve operational efficiency, and address community needs without causing harm or discrimination. AI systems must not infringe on individual privacy, civil liberties, or constitutional rights. Transparency and accountability shall be prioritized, requiring disclosure of AI use in public-facing services. An AI "Practical Guide" will be annexed to this resolution to ensure all employees understand what is and what is not permissible.

To ensure fairness and non-discrimination, AI systems must be designed and implemented to avoid bias based on race, gender, age, religion, disability, or other protected characteristics.

AI systems must comply with all applicable data privacy laws, including the New Jersey Open Public Records Act (OPRA), and adhere to cybersecurity standards. No personal data shall be used in AI systems, without it being anonymized, encrypted, and securely stored to prevent unauthorized access or misuse. Data collection shall be limited to what is necessary for the intended purpose, and individuals must be informed about how their data is being used. The data stored in AI systems may be subject to OPRA.

The Borough of Wildwood Crest may engage with residents to educate them about the use of AI in public services and gather feedback to address concerns. Public forums, workshops, or online resources are encouraged to ensure transparency and foster trust in AI initiatives.

When procuring AI systems, municipalities shall prioritize vendors that demonstrate a commitment to ethical AI practices, transparency, and compliance with relevant laws. AI systems shall conform to the NIST AI Risk Management Framework. Contracts with third-party vendors must include provisions for regular audits, data security, and accountability for AI system performance.

Before deploying AI systems, the Borough of Wildwood Crest shall conduct a thorough risk assessment and impact analysis to evaluate potential ethical, social, and legal implications. High-risk AI applications, such as those involving law enforcement or public safety, shall undergo additional scrutiny and approval processes.

AI systems shall be regularly monitored to ensure they operate as intended and adapt to changing community needs. The Borough of Wildwood Crest shall commit to continuous improvement by staying informed about advancements in AI technology and updating policies accordingly.

Prohibited uses of AI include mass surveillance, predictive policing, or any activity that violates individual rights or fosters inequity. The use of AI for decision-making in critical areas such as housing, employment, or public benefits shall be carefully regulated to prevent unfair outcomes.

All municipal employees and contractors must adhere to this policy. Non-compliance may result in disciplinary action, termination of contracts, or other legal consequences.

This policy shall be reviewed annually to ensure it remains relevant and effective in addressing the evolving landscape of AI technologies and their impact on municipal operations.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that by adopting this Responsible Use of AI Policy, the Borough of Wildwood Crest commits to leveraging AI technologies in a manner that promotes public trust, safeguards individual rights, and enhances the quality of life for all residents.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

### AI “Practical Guide”

#### Practical Organizational Guidelines for AI Use:

##### Protect Sensitive Data

- Establish a “no sensitive data in prompts” rule (e.g., no PII, PHI, financial records, passwords, internal secrets).
- Establish a rule that no names (person, company, etc.) will be used in AI request/queries.
- Prefer AI tools that offer enterprise-grade privacy guarantees where possible.

##### Require Human Oversight

AI output should never be treated as authoritative without review.

- Require employees to validate facts, especially in:
  - Legal
  - Financial
  - Medical
  - Safety-critical contexts
- Encourage a “trust but verify” mindset.

##### Maintain IP and Copyright Safety

- Require team members to:
  - Avoid pasting copyrighted content into prompts.
  - Avoid generating content that could infringe on others’ IP.
- Use AI tools that provide **copyright indemnification** for generated output

##### Use AI for the Right Tasks

- Potential AI use for:
  - Drafting
  - Summarization
  - Brainstorming
  - Data exploration (with sanitized data)
- Discourage AI use for:
  - Decisions that affect people’s rights or employment
  - High-stakes predictions
  - Unreviewed automation

**Date:** March 18, 2026

#### **Capital Projects**

1. **Bayside Bulkhead Replacement and Flood Mitigation Improvements**
  - The contractor has completed all of the underground storm sewer system piping and has completed the bulkhead installation at Primrose, Myrtle, Lotus, Fern, Forget-Me-Not, Columbine, Sweetbriar Road and Cardinal Road.
  - The contractor has remobilized and completed the bulkhead replacements at Palm Road and Wisteria Road as well as the stormwater valves. The contractor plans to return on March 23<sup>rd</sup> to complete the final concrete, restoration and paving.
2. **Reconstruction of Bayview Drive**
  - The bid opening occurred on January 29, 2026 and the apparent low bidder is Charles Marandino, LLC in the amount of \$248,055.00.
  - The preconstruction meeting was held on February 25<sup>th</sup> and the contract expects to start at the end of March.
3. **Crest Fishing Pier Reconstruction**
  - The Borough was notified by NJDCA that a \$1,087,425.00 grant was allocated for the project.
  - The Borough was notified by the Cape May County Open Space Board that a \$2,500,000.00 grant was recommended for funding.
  - The project is currently in the design phase.
4. **NJ IBank (NJIB) – Sanitary Sewer and Roadway Improvements**
  - The NJIB advised the Borough that approximately \$3,000,000.00 in grant forgiveness is available along with grant funding for engineering services.
  - The bid opening occurred on June 24, 2025 and the apparent low bidder is Charles Marandino, LLC in the amount of \$2,573,600.00. The preconstruction meeting was held on July 24<sup>th</sup>.

- Sanitary sewer replacement and concrete work are complete on Stockton Road. Concrete work has started on Topeka Avenue. Sanitary sewer work is progressing on Bayview, Pittsburg and Topeka.
5. New Jersey Avenue Sanitary Sewer and Water Main Improvements
    - The bid opening occurred on July 23, 2025 and the lowest responsible bidder is Asphalt Paving Systems, Inc in the amount of \$3,345,500.00. Please note that this project contains Wildwood Water Utility participating items in the amount of \$1,051,126.50 and Borough participating items in the amount of \$2,294,373.50.
    - The preconstruction meeting was held on October 16<sup>th</sup> and construction started in December on Primrose Rd and is working north on New Jersey Avenue.
  6. FY2024 NJDCA Small Cities Program – Crest Pier Bathroom Improvements
    - The Borough was notified that a \$400,000.00 grant was allocated by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs for Crest Pier ADA Bathroom Improvements.
    - This project is currently in the design phase.

### Grant Applications

1. FEMA Flood Mitigation Assistance (BRIC) & (HMA)
  - The Borough is proposing to submit to FEMA BRIC for two (2) bayside storm sewer pump stations and associated storm sewer improvements in the northwest section of the Borough.
  - The Borough is proposing to submit to FEMA HMA for the Washington Avenue storm sewer improvements as outlined in the recently completed study.
  - Both grant applications have secured initial selection from FEMA.
  - Additional information was provided to NJOEM on November 14<sup>th</sup>.
2. FY2025 NJDOT Municipal Aid Program
  - The NJDOT is accepting grant applications for Bikeway, Pedestrian and Roadway Improvement Projects. The application deadline is July 1, 2024.
  - Our office has been authorized by the Borough to submit the Reconstruction of Stockton Road as the grant application.
  - The grant application was submitted on May 28, 2024.
  - The Borough was notified that a \$158,190.00 grant was allocated for this project.
3. FY2026 NJDOT Municipal Aid Program
  - Our office was authorized by the Borough to submit the Reconstruction of Denver Avenue as the grant application.
  - The Borough was notified that a grant in the amount of \$116,187.00 was allocated for the project.
4. FY2026 NJDCA LRIG Program
  - Our office submitted the Borough's grant application on February 13<sup>th</sup> for the installation of new shade structures at Sunrise Park.

Commissioner Franco inquired about the bike path painting and the Engineer indicated that they received quotes and it should be done by the end of March/ beginning of April and definitely before Memorial Day weekend.

- 2. Time Limit: Each speaker will be limited to five (5) minutes. Speakers may only speak once during this portion. Time cannot be yielded to another speaker.**
- 3. Decorum: Speakers and members of the public are expected to maintain proper decorum and shall civilly make their comments. Personal attacks, obscenity,**

**-Historical museum - 2025** – No movement from previous meeting. On hold.

**-Traffic Calming** – No movement from previous meeting. We did not receive the grant for Park Boulevard; we can address in the I Bank and phased in.

**-Back Beach Excavation:** No movement from previous meeting. Public Works has installed snow fence to raise low levels and we will survey a test pilot area to see how it is working.

**-Dredging:** Commissioner Franco indicated they are looking at outside engineering for assistance.

**-Washington / Seaview – beach outfalls and capacity:** No movement from previous meeting. Waiting to hear about award and could be as much as 25 million from FEMA.

**-US ACE / NJ DEP Dune:** There is another meeting scheduled for March 10, 2026 at 10:00 am between the borough, USACE and NJ DEP. No movement from previous meeting. It was noted that the original plan has been modified with the contribution from Wildwood Crest being minimal. The Mayor also requested that our dunes keep the gaps so it is accessible for the elderly and disabled. Also, it was mentioned about the root cause that Hereford Inlet channel is narrowing and pinching off and hopefully this will widen the inlet.

**-Borough Hall Renovations-** No movement from previous meeting. We have the renderings and this may need to be phased in and a meeting will need to be scheduled.

**-Digitize Paper Files:** No movement from previous meeting.
