**ORDINANCE NO. 1474**

**ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ARTICLE  
VIII OF CHAPTER 46 OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES  
ESTABLISHING A FORMAL CONTRACT NEGOTIATING  
COMMITTEE**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest has determined that it is necessary and proper for good government, order, efficiency and economy of government, and as authorized by N.J.S.A. 40:72-5 of the Walsh Act, to amend Chapter 46, Officers and Employees of the Code of the Borough of Wildwood Crest to create a formal negotiating committee to negotiate contracts with collective bargaining units on behalf of the Brough of Wildwood Crest.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, as follows:

**Section 1.** A portion of Ordinance Number 1313 adopted 10/23/2019, and a portion of Ordinance Number 1200 adopted 12/23/2014 and codified in the Code of the Borough of Wildwood Crest as Chapter 46, Article VIII, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows: (added language is underlined, deleted language is stricken)

**§46-45 Negotiating Committee.**

There is hereby created a negotiating committee to be known as the Collective Bargaining Unit Negotiation Committee, which shall be composed of the Borough Administrator, Chief Financial Officer, Labor Counsel, and the Commissioner of the department in which the collective bargaining unit resides. The Committee shall be responsible for negotiating contracts with all collective bargaining units and other contractual employees within the Borough and shall report periodically to the Board of Commissioners concerning the status of all contract negotiations and shall submit such contracts to the Board of Commissioners for final approval by resolution.


**Section 2.** The remainder of all other sections and subsections of the aforementioned ordinance not specifically amended by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.


**Section 3.** All other ordinances in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.


**Section 4.** If any portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance, but shall be confined in its effect to the provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.


**Section 5.** This ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days after final passage and advertisement thereof as required by law.
