**ORDINANCE NO. 1486**

**ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING  
CHAPTER 79 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC RESTRICTING  
THE USE OF PARKING ON MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TO  
PERSONS UTILIZING THE FACILITIES LOCATED  
THEREON**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest has determined that it is necessary and proper for good government, order and the protection of persons and property, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the Borough and its inhabitants to amend and supplement Chapter 79 of the Code of the Borough of Wildwood Crest to restrict the use of parking areas in connection with municipal facilities to only persons who are using the facilities located on the property.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Wildwood Crest, in the County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**Section 1.** A new section is hereby created which shall be added to Article II of Chapter 79 which shall read as follows:

**§ 79-8.5. Parking for use of municipal facilities.**

- A. Parking areas and spaces on the following properties are restricted to only persons who are utilizing facilities, businesses, services, or attending events that are located on the property:

<b>Name of Street facility</b>	<b>Location</b>
Borough Hall Parking Lot	Lots 11 and 12 in Block 34.01
Crest Arts Pavilion	All parking spaces accessed from Wisteria Road and Columbine Road between Ocean Avenue and Beach Avenue, excluding electric vehicle charging spaces
Crest Memorial School	Lot 1.01 in Block 176
Crest Pier Parking Lot	Lot 1 in Block 21.03
Joseph Von Savage Memorial Pool	Lots 1-7 and 11-13 in Block 157
Washington Avenue Park	Lot 4 in Block 184 and Lot 1 in Block 185

- B. Violations and penalty. Any person who commits a violation of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 and/or be imprisoned in the County Jail for a term not exceeding 90 days. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

**Section 2.** The remainder of all other sections and subsections of the aforementioned ordinance not specifically amended by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section 3.** All other ordinances in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.


**Section 4.** If any portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance, but shall be confined in its effect to the provision directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

**Section 5.** This ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days after final passage and advertisement thereof as required by law.


